South Carolina Lutheran Men in Mission will continue to provide financial support for the development of mission congregations in the South Carolina Synod through the New Mission Start Fund, the Gift Fund, the Loan Fund, and the Segelken Fund and have opportunities to make disciples of men by sponsoring gatherings, local congregational meetings, regional (conference) meetings, and Bible Studies with the National Lutheran Men in Mission Master Builders Bible.

South Carolina Lutheran Men in Mission is supporting five mission churches: Manatial de Vida in north Columbia, Cristo Rey in West Columbia, Breath of Life in Blythewood, Crossroads in Indian Land (Fort Mill), and Faith in Pickens. Each mission church received checks from the Gift Fund during the recent SCLMM Convention Banquet.

The purpose of the Men in Action (MIA) Ministry is to make disciples of men ages 18 to "45-ish." A rafting trip is scheduled for the second weekend in July of this year. The One Year to Live (OYTL) Retreat will be held on April 30 through May 2, 2010, at the Kinard Conference Center.

Finally, a big thank you to the Lutheran Church of the Incarnation (in Columbia), which allowed South Carolina Lutheran Men in Mission to use a photograph of its chancel mural "Ascending Christ" as the cover of the 2010 SCLMM Directory.



incoming Lutheran men President, *Ken Heckel* was passed the gavel by outgoing President *Doug McKenzie* at the 2010 Lutheran Men in Mission Convention held at the Lutheran Church of Our Savior in Greenville, SC on Saturday, February 21, 2010. Also installed as officers were Vice President *Joe Fulmer (Messiah Mauldin), Promotional Secretary Dan Camp (Living Springs Columbia), Secretary Brain Dooley (Faith Pickens), and Pastoral Advisor Rev. Mark Cerniglia (Our Savior Greenville).*

Ken Heckel, the Executive Committee and the Board of Directors will be emphasizing the objectives and goals with all the church units. Several significant goals are:

- 1. Emphasizing that the Lutheran man read their Bible every day;
- 2. Lutheran Men is not just mission congregations, but also "men" & "young men's" ministry.
- 3. Remind the rostered leaders that we need their participation;
- 4. Work hard to help struggling units and start/restart nine (9) men's units;5. Meet the financial goals approved by the board for 2010.

For the banquet, held at the Lutheran Church of Our Savior, each of the mission congregations brought a large group of church members to help celebrate the acceptance of the Gift Fund checks. *Dick Hankins*, Gift Fund Chairman praised all of the churches in the SC synod that supported the Gift Fund and made possible the exciting event of passing out the checks, totaling about \$35,000 to 5 mission congregations:


