NEW BUSINESS

Special Events Director Johnny Merck introduced Chief Pete Parr and Glen Cook of the Pee Dee Indian tribe. Mr. Merck also presented written or printed materials of the needs of the tribe, which are in an impoverished area and not served by local medical facilities. Although the tribe is not requesting funds from SCLMM, they are requesting assistance similar to that provided by congregations in the South Carolina Synod for the Safe Water Project in Tanzania. Mr. Merck presented the following motion:

To designate Sunday, November 1, 2015, as “Pee Dee Indian Tribe of South Carolina Sunday.”
Donations received will be used toward the construction of a new building for the use of meetings, office space, a medical clinic, and a shelter. The Goal for this project is \$50,000.

The motion was seconded. In discussion about the motion, Mr. Merck indicated that contributions would be sent to the South Carolina Synod, not to South Carolina Lutheran Men in Mission. The question was called, and the motion was approved.

PeeDee Indian Tribe Sunday. Have 15 acres of land need building for medical treatment, feed hot meals, clothing distribution, helping community and people. Metal building . We have not been able to help but God is in the works, he has never failed me.

Cook Builders estimate is \$97,608. for 30x40 building. Bishop Yoos is onboard and presenting to synod council.

Motion to accept as project with November 1st 2015 being Pee Dee Indian Tribe Sunday. Second, discussion, we are in support of Pee Dee's with NC Synod. Synod support will assist and money will come through Synod. Much logistics, Johnny Merck will lead. This is close to home and we should support. There are eight clusters of congregations supporting ministry to PeeDee's. Need is overwhelming, very impoverished, little employment. Need PpT presentation to inform congregations. Approved unanimous.

Loan Committee

There has been one loan application since the March 2015 Executive Board meeting.

Springs of Grace has submitted an application for a \$300,000 loan to build a \$500,000 multi-purpose building on property they own. This will be the first building on their property. Pastor Beaver was contacted to determine the status of the congregation and found it to be a fully sanctioned worshipping community organized in 2001.

Presently Springs of Grace is in a renewal phase.

Pastor Hobby Outten was contacted and Springs of Grace has filed an application with MIF for \$200,000. MIF is presently studying the application.

The application has not been brought to committee yet because we were researching additional information.

- Copy of the construction application
- Finalization of building permits
- A church with a non-mission status can only apply for \$150,000. We will clarify this issue with Springs of Grace and MIF.

- Although they are 6 months from construction start they want to break ground in September.

The loan committee is expected to meet to consider the Springs of Grace application before the August Executive Board Meeting.

SCLMM received a plaque from LMM for our contribution last year. My suggestion is that we thank Doug Haugen for it but request that they save the money spent on plaques for SCLMM and send us a letter instead. We do not have any good place to display items such as this.

I received an invitation for SCLMM to have a display at the Dutch Fork Cluster "Jubilee" day on August 30. I accepted and plan to put up a display there. I would welcome any of you to come if you are able. I will get more information on it later and will advise. I am not sure if we will have an opportunity to do anything other than the display or not.

The church today is changing in many ways. One of these is the approach to developing mission congregations. The definition of what constitutes a "mission start" is not always the same as in previous years. I recommend that we get some clarification on

terms and definitions from the Synod/ELCA on Congregations Under Development, Re-development, Renewal, etc. We may need to consider changing some of the language in our guidelines to make sure that we are in a position to help our young congregations within the framework of our guidelines.

Within the last few years we have embarked on several new and exciting ministries including OYTL, improving and building relationships with LTSS and the students, reaching out to our brothers in the Caribbean synod, finding new ways to reach out to the younger generation to name a few. We need to be constantly thinking "outside the box" on what we can do to support men's ministry and the church. I applaud you all for your efforts and let's never stop dreaming about what may be possible.
